Same Day Registration Basics

In the state of Minnesota, any eligible voter can register to vote at the polls on Election Day. Same day registration will require voters to step into another line and fill out the voter registration card. If you haven't registered to vote before the election, follow these guidelines to make sure that you have everything you need to register and vote on November 4, 2008.

Acceptable forms of identification:

- A current Minnesota driver's license or Minnesota ID card, learner's permit, or authorized federal tribal ID with your current address.
- If you do not have a Minnesota driver's license, Minnesota ID card, or tribal ID card with your current address on it, you can register in a variety of other ways:
 - Using a voucher (a person who is registered to vote *in your precinct*). The voucher will take an oath at the polling place swearing that they know that you live in the precinct. If you are a resident of a residential facility, employees of that facility may vouch for you (ask your residential facility today!)
 - Using an original utilities bill with voter's name and current address, provided the bill is within 30 days of Election Day, along with a photo ID (including military ID, U.S. passport, student ID, tribal ID, or a Minnesota driver's license listing your previous address).
 - Using a student ID that contains a photo, as long as you are listed at the polling place as living in student housing. If you do not live in student housing, your student ID along with a school registration or fee statement that includes your current address will be sufficient.
 - Using a "Notice of Late Registration" from your county auditor
